Bookings.

All Homeleigh bookings should be made to Homeleigh Booking <accomm@rimstone.org.au>. This is important as periodically the booking officer is away and arrangements are made to cover his absence through the accommodation email. Please remember that although bookings are not mandatory, you cannot be assured of a bed if you have not booked. Also bookings are for a bed, not necessarily a room to yourself if there are large numbers of people.

Homeleigh Grounds Maintenance.

The directors are working on a maintenance schedule for the grounds. Currently there is no external provider undertaking the grounds maintenance and we are going to trial doing the work 'in house'. The idea is that the mowing and brushcutting need doing about 12 times a year, roughly (every six weeks in Autumn/winter and every 3-4 weeks in spring/summer). We are calling upon 12 members to contribute one weekend each a year to undertake the grounds maintenance.

The earlier you reply to directors@rimstone.org.au and nominate the weekend (week!) you would prefer the better chance you have of getting the time that suits you. The directors will put together a calendar of who is doing the grounds and when and publish in a future newsletter. Rimstone provides all the equipment/fuel and accommodation. You just need to get to Buchan and have an enjoyable time pottering around in the garden. Instruction will be provided on all the equipment as required.

Scrubby Creek Cave Property News

The property has had little stocking, partly because of wild dogs, a number of which have been shot. They have been filmed on the property by DSE. The low stocking is therefore providing a chance for the grass to recover. Initial spraying some of the blackberries was undertaken in Autumn.

There was a trip in December 2012 to the outer portion of Scrubby Creek Cave using scaling poles to investigate high level leads. This did not get high enough and another trip is planned. Rudy Frank has taken some aerial photographs of the tufa using his camera mounted on a 6 m pole. Please note that all caving access is by prior arrangements and via a listed trip by an ASF Member Club (VSA). Please check with the more detailed information in Newsletter 14 (November 2012).

We have paid down the outstanding loans from members and friends with recent donations. We need further donations which can be direct to Rimstone or via the ASF Karst Conservation Fund tax deductible facility. This is now on the new ASF website with a Pay Pal donation account (you need to identify that the donation is for Scrubby Appeal). See information below.

The following assistance is needed

1. Assistance with **planning protective fencing of the tufa terraces**.
2. **Planning assistance and expertise with a weed control program**, for implementation in Spring-Autuum. Weeds are blackberry, thistle (2 species), fleabane, horehound and bracken.
- 3 . Assistance with **weed control**.
