Homeleigh Property Management

Just a few lines from the Homeleigh Property Manager: Paul Brooker.

1. Working Bees.

A working bee was held at Homeleigh on the weekend of 25-26 August. Eight members turned up to help cross some of the jobs off the very long list.

Some of the more significant tasks completed included:-

- Painting room 15 just needs some minor final touches for completion.
- Plastering and undercoating the remainder of the passageways.
- Adding the dado trim and some of the skirtings to the passageways.
- Another 4 bedrooms received new architraves around their doors.
- Some serious spring cleaning saw the kitchen transformed, particularly around the stoves and cook tops.
 - The hedge had a serious haircut.
- Many of the old fence posts around the boundary were removed to assist in the yard maintenance.
- Much of the ceiling received insulation which made an immediate noticeable difference.
- The usual lawn mowing and brush-cutting tidied up the yard.

A trial planting of Lomandra longlifolia (native Spinyhead Mat-rush,or Basket Grass) was undertaken on the steep slope behind the tool shed. The intention is to find a suitable solution to assist in the maintenance of this difficult area. This is a native hardy grass that is widespread native along eastern Australia including East Gippsland.

Also during the working bee an emergency evacuation was carried out to test our systems - much to the annoyance of those working in the roof space! We are pleased all went well.

Next Working Bee is programmed for the weekend of 24-25 November 2012. This s a great chance for those members yet to attend a working bee this year to come along and do your bit. Remember that to own such a great place requires commitment from everyone involved...not just a handful of regulars.

Some of the jobs programmed for this weekend include (but not limited to):

- Repair the floor in the toilet block Concrete Cancer has struck!
- Replace damaged toilet bowl in mens.
- · Replace main front doors and door jam.

- Carpet room 15.
- · Major yard clean up prior to fire season.

There will be jobs for all abilities so don't think you can't attend just because you may not be the most 'handy' person around...and besides they are great social weekends!

2. Long Term Maintenance Schedule.

The directors are putting together a plan that will map out the maintenance and ongoing reonvations of Homeleigh over the next 5 years. The aim is to have a comprehensive timeline that gives Rimstone some direction in regards to priority of maintenance and renovations. This will clarify budgetary requirements, materials acquisitions and ensure we have the appropriate skills available as/when required.

After the next working bee it is hoped that the renovation of all but one room of the south wing of bedrooms will be completed. The replacement of the windows and replastering, painting etc of the west wing bedrooms is envisioned as the next task as well as the refurbishment of that last room on the south side. After that we will need to think through ideas on the front living room and the ex caretakers areas and then perhaps the bungalows.

The directors are therefore seeking input from members as to what you consider to be priority maintenance issues. If you would like input as to what and when certain improvements should occur let a director know ASAP.

We are not in the business of renovating Homeleigh just for the sake of it. The aim is to ensure ongoing maintenance is carried out and we can improve the overall comfort for ourselves and our guests. So the directors need to know from the members what you want.
